GET OUT *of town*

Fall is the only stretch of the year when Birmingham sits inside easy reach of three completely different trips. The mountains turn in October and Cheaha is under two hours. The Gulf stays warm into November and empties out. And the cities within half a day are at their best once it is finally cool enough to walk them. Pick one Saturday a month and you can do all three before Thanksgiving.



UNDER TWO HOURS

Cheaha State Park — *1 hr 40 min* — Alabama's highest point at 2,407 feet. Walk out to the Bald Rock boardwalk, which is flat and stroller-friendly, and you get the whole state turning underneath you. Go the third weekend of October and stay for sunset.

Mentone + Little River Canyon — *1 hr 45 min* — The closest thing Alabama has to a mountain town. DeSoto Falls, Little River Falls, antique shops on the main street, and cabins on Lookout Mountain if you want to make it two days.

Noccalula Falls, Gadsden — *1 hour* — A 90-foot waterfall you can walk behind, on 500 acres with a petting zoo and a mini train. The easiest half-day trip on this list with kids in the car.

HALF A DAY

Chattanooga, Tennessee — *2 hours* — Lookout Mountain and Rock City for the color, the Aquarium when everyone gets tired, and a downtown built for walking. The one that works for every age at once.

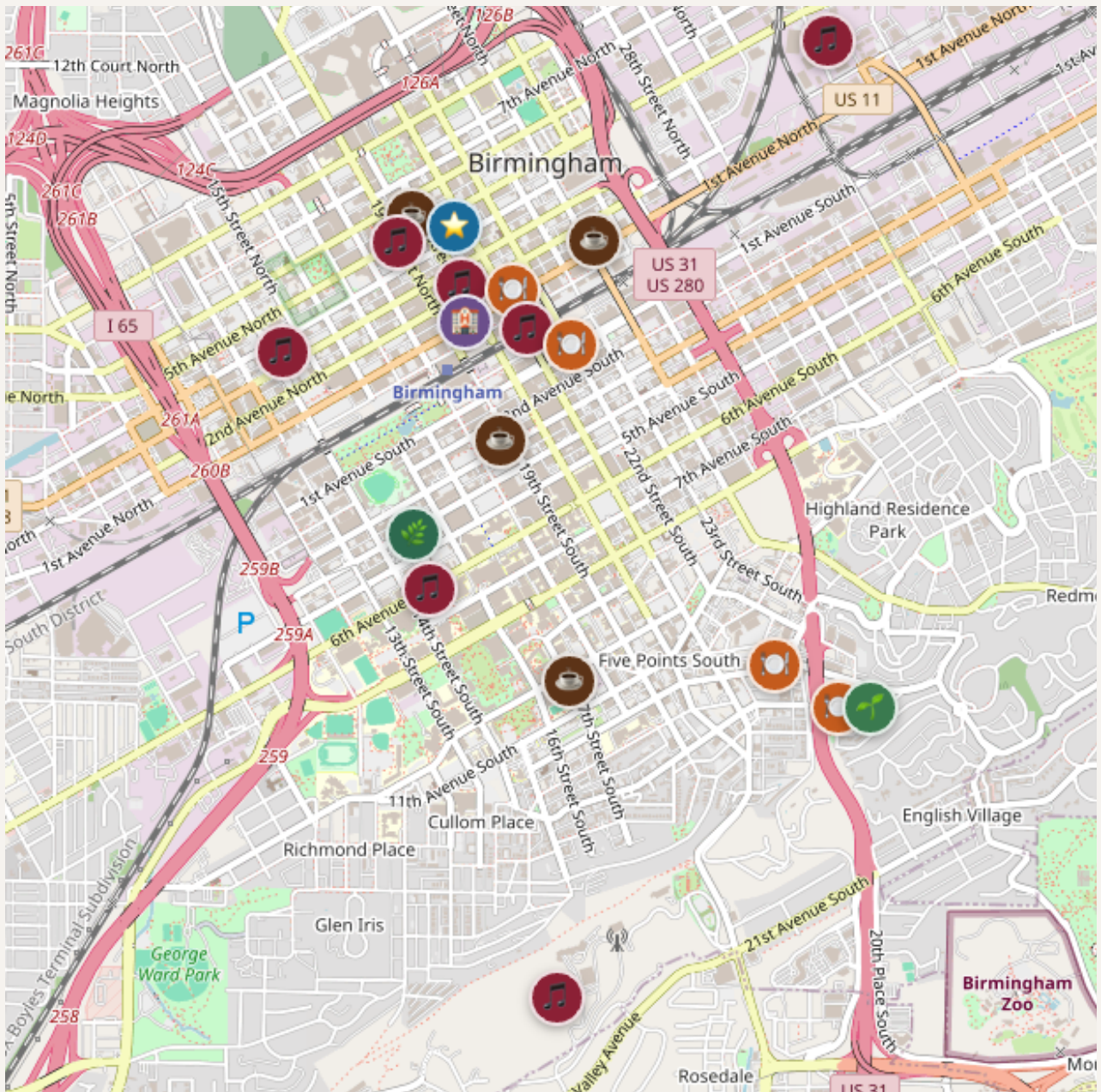
Pensacola, Florida — *4 hours* — Still warm enough to get in the water, with none of the summer crowd. No wait for a table, no line for the boardwalk, and on a weekday the beach is basically yours.

Blue Ridge, Georgia — *4 hours* — Real mountain fall. The scenic railway, cabin rentals with a porch worth sitting on, and a downtown you can cover in an afternoon.
